


# What does it mean to be a #BT Collaborator?




# What does it mean to be a Full Signatory?




## **Case Study: Better Practice Social Licence Guidelines**

The co-design and development of the Better Practice Social Licence Guideline with the ag sector was critical to developing a deeper understanding of:

- The ways electricity transmission infrastructure impacts agricultural landholders and their communities
- The principles that underpin how to build and maintain social licence for landholders and communities affected by renewable energy developments
- Practical opportunities to minimise impacts and deliver shared value during the planning, construction, operation and decommissioning of energy infrastructure.

By validating impacts and identifying opportunities to improve outcomes for landholders, the Better Practice Guideline supports businesses to better understand and act on, the factors that contribute to building trust and maintaining social licence with agricultural landholders and their communities. It also supports agricultural representatives, landholders and host communities to raise and discuss known impacts and work constructively with energy businesses to achieve shared value outcomes.





This collaboration led the way for our current **Priority #BT Landholder and Social Licence** which includes:

- The **Ag Energy Strategic Roundtable** with leaders from the energy and agriculture sectors to discuss emerging issues in the energy transition, identify what's working and areas for continuous improvement
- The Undergrounding transmission infrastructure initiative (from July 2023)
- A new Community of Practice on Transitioning Communities and Community Benefit Schemes (from August 2023)



### **Case study: Biodiversity + Renewables**

To deliver better outcomes in the intersection between biodiversity and renewable energy infrastructure, our #BT collaborators are:

- Building a container for safe discussion and genuine relationships between conservation and environmental groups and the energy sector
- Developing a shared understanding of the risks and opportunities in the intersection between biodiversity and renewable energy infrastructure
- Identifying leaders and committed to work on change collaboratively



Key collaborators: Led by **RE Alliance**, **Cairns and Far North Qld Environmental Centre**, with support from Powerlink, CS Energy, Energy Qld, CleanCo, Stanwell, renewable developers and a broad group of conservation groups including WWF, ACF and Qld Conservation Society.

Activities: Workshops kicked off in 2022 agreeing to focus on biodiversity mapping and Better Practice Guidelines for Biodiversity and Renewables in Queensland.



Biodiversity is a critical issue for the developers of renewable energy assets and the communities in which they operate.
